

Personal Data Protection Notice for YOUR way to Germany survey

The OECD is committed to protecting the personal data it processes, in accordance with its Personal Data Protection [Rules](#).

The Directorate for Employment, Labour and Social Affairs is using this survey to collect personal data, including socio-demographic information, e-mail addresses, and information about migration intentions, preferences and experiences from skilled international professionals interested in working in Germany. The survey is intended for adults only.

The data will be used to analyse Germany's strategy to promote migration pathways for skilled migrants, including potential perceived barriers. The survey is intended as a longitudinal study with three survey rounds. Participants who voluntarily shared their email addresses in the first round will be contacted again after 6 and 12 months respectively, to assess their experiences with the German immigration system over the time-span of the study.

The survey is part of a research project conducted by the OECD on behalf of the German Federal Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs. The personal data collected will be anonymised and confidentially shared with the German Ministry.

Your data will be stored in the OECD's internal database at the OECD premises in Paris and retained until the termination of the study. Only staff members of the International Migration Division of the OECD's Directorate for Employment, Labour and Social Affairs have access to your data.
